
Quarterly Media Report *April - June 2023*

Three noticeable spikes in media coverage dominate this quarter's media report.

The first occurred on April 13, when Professor Becca Levy released her findings that older persons with mild cognitive impairment (MCI) were 30% more likely to regain normal cognition if they had positive beliefs about aging. Outlets such as NBC Today, the New York Post, Fortune, and the UPI news service picked up the story.

The second occurred on May 6, when Associate Professor Jason Schwartz spoke to the Associated Press about CDC Director Rochelle Walensky's decision to resign. The AP story circulated in media outlets around the country.

The most recent spike happened on June 22 when Professor Schwartz spoke to ABC News about a possible new vaccine for respiratory syncytial virus or RSV. YSPH also was mentioned in a widely circulated Delta Dental news release regarding results of the Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (CAHPS) Dental Plan Survey. YSPH helped validate the survey tool for the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ).
